#### A wonderful time



## A VERY IMPORTANT YEAR

Dear Jim,

I am genuinely sorry that the NATO Nuclear Planning Group meeting keeps me from attending the 1984 AAAA Convention and, in particular, keeps me from fulfilling your request to present the Outstanding Aviation Unit of the Year Award.

1984 is a very important year for Army Aviation and consequently a very important year for AAAA. We see the first Apache coming off the production line, the CH-47D coming into the force, and the BLACK HAWKs being distributed to the Army and upholding the reputation that they earned in battle in Grenada. The Aviation Branch was born in 1984. We can all look forward to new and exciting contributions for Army Aviation in the context of the Total Army and the Army's contribution to the defense forces of the nation.

Army Aviation faces some important challenges. The first challenge is to make certain that its activation as a branch by itself doesn't move it away from the other combat branches; rather it must move even closer if we are to get the most out of the capabilities of the new hardware and the top-notch Aviation officers and soldiers we now have in the force. There will be a tendency for some to say that the Armed Forces now has four air forces instead of three. The members of the Army Aviation Branch must make it clear that Army Aviation is a ground combat branch that uses the medium

of the air to provide extraordinary mobility for ground combat operations. Army Aviation uses air to provide roads where there are no roads and hills where there are no hills. Yet at the same time it uses the existing terrain for cover and concealment just as do the Infantry and the Armor.

We must make certain that we use the extraordinary capabilities we have built into the Army in the best possible way. The new helicopters, the new tanks, the infantry fighting vehicles, MLRS and other modernized artillery, new sensors, new intelligence fusion techniques, distributed information systems, and above all very good soldiers give us the opportunity to make combat teams on the battlefield more effective than any that have ever been seen before.

The key to all that is the teamwork of the infantry, armor, artillery, and aviation units. All have to understand each other's capabilities and limitations. I firmly believe that we will find that smaller integrated teams will be far more useful than in the past. The Aviation Branch is the new player in this exercise and as such will carry an extraordinary burden for insuring that teamwork exists. Given the example set by this year's Outstanding Unit of the Year, Task Force 160, I am confident that the Army Aviation Branch will do what needs to be done.

Please pass my congratulations to Task Force 160 and my best wishes to my fellow AAAA members.

## A TALE OF TWO SOLDIERS

he Chief of Staff and I decided that we'd make sure that we would visit with each one of the wounded that came out of Grenada. I was over at Walter Reed Army Medical Center with the first group that came in. I met two youngsters there, one was a BLACK HAWK crew chief and the other was a Ranger, with two entirely different stories. I'll tell both of them because I think it's important to understand the quality of the young people who are presenting themselves for service in our Army.

#### "My buddy saved my life"

The BLACK HAWK youngster was about 24 years old, and I reached over to pin on a Purple Heart and pass pleasantries. He'd been hit in the leg with an AK-47 round, and he just reached up and grabbed me and pulled me right down on the bed. Well, I hadn't been hugged by a BLACK HAWK crew chief in some time, and once I extricated myself he said: "Listen, General, I just want to tell you one thing — my buddy saved my life." I said: "Well, tell me the story."

He said: "My buddy and I went through BLACK HAWK crew chiefs school at Fort Eustis, and he saved my life. You see, he died a month before the Grenada invasion in the crash of a BLACK HAWK off Panama, and he went to heaven, and he interceded with God when it came to a very difficult strait for me, and he saved my life."

That's a 24 year old BLACK HAWK crew chief. I'm telling you, that brought tears to my eyes. He had a high faith in God, and he was willing to testify to it. He also spoke about his buddy, his cohort guy, the guy who went to school with him, who built that bridge, not only in the unit but in the school situation as well. So, there's a lesson in that for all of us.

So, I walked across the hall and over on the other side was a 2nd of the 75th Ranger from Fort Lewis, Washington. And I said: "Say, Troop, what happened to you?" And he said: "Well, I got shot in the leg with an AK-47 round." And I said: "How'd that happen?" And he said: "I came around the corner and there were three bad guys there, and I shot three of them and they shot one of me." He said: "Three to one isn't bad, is it General?"

I asked him: "Is it really true that you went in there at 450 feet without your reserve parachutes on?" And he said: "Yes, sir. That's what we did." And I said: "How was that?" He said: "Exciting!"

For you who don't know, we normally do that from a little higher up, and we usually have a reserve.

Well, I reached down and pinned the Purple Heart on him and then I said: "There's one other thing you're going to get here, Soldier, and that's the Combat Infantryman's Badge." Now he was laying down on the bed, because he was shot in the leg, and he just reached up and ripped open his pajamas and said: "Just punch it right in there!"

#### Thousands of the best

Now, the point I'm bringing up with those two stories is that those are two dynamite youngsters who have come to work in our United States Army. They've met the call of duty. They went to combat. They did a dynamite job for you and I. We've got thousands of those young men and women who are presenting themselves for great officership and leadership, and do you know what? We've got it. It's in this room. It's in this Army. Thanks a lot. I hope you have a nice meeting!

## "THEN AND NOW"

REVIEW of history brings out two basic truths that have strongly influenced the equipment, organization, and doctrine of military aviation.

First, pilots have a hypnotic fascination for large or fast aircraft with lots of gadgets and buttons to push. Second, these larger aircraft are always more expensive, more complicated, and require a great deal more support dictating centralization in control and basing.

Let's take a look at the impact of these truths on the Army Air Corps in the 1930s. The Army Air Corps had developed a series of observation aircraft that were large, fast, and complicated. They based them at centralized locations away from the Artillery — they were no longer responsive. The artillerymen saw this as a void, and to fill this void they created the Army Artillery Air OP's. Organic Army Aviation was born. The Air Force tried to get back into the act. They bought L-5s and formed Air Force Liaison Squadrons — but they were just too late.

#### Amazing growth

Since the beginning of Army Aviation in the early 1940's as the organic aviation of the Artillery, Army Aviation has expanded amazingly in types of missions flown, types of aircraft, and in size. Throughout its development, Army Aviation has met severe challenges in roles and missions and in competition for budget, and this has been good.

Every expansion of Army Aviation has been scrutinized at all levels of government. I, therefore, have to conclude that the present organization of Army Aviation and the choice of equipment is sound. However, Army Aviation

must not stagnate or rest on its laurels. The trend towards bigger and faster aircraft is still evident in the Air Force and now in Army Aviation.

The result is that again voids are forming and these voids are going to expand. To me these voids present both dangers and opportunities. The danger I see is that Army Aviation is following the pattern of the old Army Air Corps. Each new aircraft is more sophisticated and more expensive than the last and will be operated in more centralized organizations.

No longer do the Artillery, Infantry, Armor, Signal Corps, or Engineers have their own aircraft and their own pilots based with them. This withdrawal of the organic aircraft from the various branches of the Army, combined with today's formation of an Army Aviation branch, is having a bad synergistic effect on the image of the Army Aviator.

#### Getting out of touch

Many now see Army Aviators throwing a white scarf over their shoulders and flying off into the wild blue yonder. Don't be deluded into thinking that the whole Army warmly embraces this new Army Aviation branch. You heard General Richardson here yesterday express his reluctance in going along with the Army Aviation branch.

It was significant that when Army Magazine, which is the voice of AUSA, published their notice that the Army had formed an Army Aviation branch, it was a little squib about this big in the rear of the magazine. They gave more space to the new helmet that was being developed.





Face it — you have an image problem and you have an operational problem. You can overcome these problems only by performance.

Training, doctrine, and personal dedication to outstanding support of ground commanders will

counteract the adverse image.

Throughout the presentations that I have heard during the last two days, starting with General Vessey's letter, I keep hearing a new term. It's called integration and it appears the effort now is to provide the responsiveness that we used to obtain by the organic concept in aviation by integration of aviation into the team.

#### Serving the ground commander

This may work very well at the higher levels, but I am not sure it's going to satisfy the commanders at the lower levels who are used to having their own aircraft. I urge that in the doctrine and in the operating procedure of the new branch and its centralization, that maximum use be made of operational control of individual aircraft, or small units, by the ground commanders.

We saw in Vietnam where aviation units that belonged to the 1st Aviation Brigade, habitually worked with and were, for all intents and purposes, under the operational control of Division or Brigade Commanders. They really believed these aircraft belonged to them and they were quite possessive. If this highly responsive support is not given somehow to the ground commanders, I think you may see them viewing this once more as a void just as the artilleryman did during WW II.

I read in our local newspapers down in Texas

that the Army — not Army Aviation — has bought a few ultra-light air vehicles. It would appear that they may be exploring this field.

Countering this "flyboy" image and having a solid understanding of ground combat within Army Aviation as emphasized by several of the speakers during the last two days, is not going

to be too easy in the future.

You no longer are going to have aviators such as Howze, Vessey, Kinnard, Tolson, Wright, and Norton who earned outstanding reputations in ground combat before they became the leaders in Army Aviation. Their image has been the image of Army Aviation. Who is going to sell Army Aviation to the Army based on his in-depth experience in ground combat?

The organization of Army Aviation that has emerged can, I believe, provide the responsiveness that I have dealt with. This new organization does present the capability to react to the other voids that I would like to discuss.

#### A void in transport aircraft

A void, or opportunity, I see is in the transport area. The Army is responsible for part of the intra-theater airlift and does it very well with the CH-47. But the Air Force is still responsible for a good-sized portion of the intra-theater airlift. Again, here the pilot's fascination for larger and faster aircraft is quite evident.

The CARIBOU and the C-123 have disappeared without replacement. The Air Force has made two abortive attempts to develop even a replacement for the C-130. The AMST died after two prototypes. The C-17, an aircraft in the 400,000-lb. category, is just barely alive, and some people are now recommending that in-

stead of the C-17 they ought to buy more C-5s.

Although the Air Force has continually justified aircraft, such as the C-130 and the C-5, as having a short unprepared field capability, they have never demonstrated it. They have not landed any of these aircraft anyplace other than on well prepared airfields that met very stringent Air Force requirements.

In future warfare, airfields are going to be highly vulnerable to enemy attack — and Jack Mackmull, if you think you had trouble with small airfields down there in Grenada, wait until you try to operate in the Middle East. Don't count on having a jet-capable airfield anywhere

near your combat situation.

The military airlift situation today, to me, is quite comparable to what you would see if you amalgamated all of the airlines in the United States into one big national airline and then gave them a monopoly on all airlift. They would buy nothing but wide-bodied jets because they're more cost-effective.

If you wanted to catch an airliner, you'd have to first go to a big city. Your destination would also have to be a big city, preferably on another continent. If you wanted to ship something, you'd have to get it to a big city and not only would you have to do that, but you'd have to let it sit there until they had a payload to go into a big aircraft.

#### We pay the price

We saw that in Vietnam. You couldn't get the Air Force to carry anything in a C-130 unless they had a full load. It didn't make any difference how badly you needed it. There'd no longer be regional airlines or feeder airlines; there would be no Airborne or Federal Express. Intra-theater transport primarily supports the Army. It is the Army that will pay the price if the mission isn't carried out even though it may be the Air Force's portion that fails.

It appears to me that what is required is a replacement for the CARIBOU and the C-123 — probably about the same capacity, speed, and range — but with VTOL capability. It could belong to the Army or it could belong to the Arm force but recent history indicates that under its present priorities, the Air Force will not develop or procure any transport aircraft in this size category.

Fortunately, an aircraft is being developed that will do the job. It is the JVX. The Army's

dropped out of its development program and I think this is good. As Mr. Justus White (HASC Staff Member) just pointed out, the history of joint development programs has not been good. The problem has been that each of the Services, as he pointed out, insists upon developing the aircraft to its detailed requirement.

The problem was very clearly stated by Willis Hawkins, who used to be the Assistant Secretary of the Army for R&D, when he said: "The specifications for a turkey roaster and a chamber pot may look alike, but the joint prod-

uct won't sell."

It is true, however, that aircraft that are developed for one Service, or developed commercially, have and will continue to be bought for the Services even though they don't meet their specific requirements. The Army should support the development of the JVX. General Knudson indicated an interest. I think it's got to be greater than an interest — it's got to be a statement that you're seriously looking at it.

I do not recommend that you participate in the development, but as long as the Army pushes and says: "We are sincerely interested in the JVX for the intra-theater mission to meet a requirement," as a minimum you're going to keep the Air Force in the development with funds. The Air Force won't try to influence the specifications too much. You know that's too little for them to worry about, but we need their money.

As (Lt. Gen.) Jim Vaught pointed out, and as Mr. White confirmed here today, the Air Force as our first line of expense can go ahead and pay the bill without even missing it out of their pocket. So get in there and push it because this can probably be the Army's replacement for the CARIBOU that we previously lost and still need.

#### Anti-helicopter warfare

The final void, or opportunity, I will discuss is the anti-helicopter role. Yesterday's presentations were very enlightening. I was delighted when General Richardson used a slide that said, "Air-to-air combat." At last the Army at the highest level is getting ready to admit that we must face up to air-to-air combat. General Maddox said, "They're writing the manuals on how to perform air-to-air combat." He didn't say what they're going to do it with. Jack Mackmull mentioned it and I think Jack Mackmull has got a real good appreciation. But going back to

General Richardson's comment, after I was elated at seeing the air-to-air slide, my balloon burst because what he said as he got into the air-to-air combat mission was "to protect our helicopters."

The major point is missed. I would like to discuss this. All modern military forces appear to have come to the conclusion that the helicopter is a very effective anti-tank weapon. I quote Lieutenant General Reznichenke of the Soviet Army in an article in "Red Star", the Soviet Army paper. In this article on helicopters he said, "They are superior to other anti-tank weapons in terms of field of vision, maneuverability, and fire-power. They are capable of hitting armored targets while remaining out of reach of anti-tank weapons. The correlation between tank and helicopter losses is 12 to 1, or even 19 to 1 in the helicopter's favor, according to practical experiments."

#### Our highest priority

The Soviets must believe this. They're building more helicopters than we are, and they have a very impressive Hind-D. If the attack helicopter is as effective as we and the Soviets believe it to be, we should be concentrating on countering it. It should be the highest priority target on the battlefield. If a battle was scored on a point system, the kill of an enemy tank ought to be one point. The kill of an attack helicopter ought to be 15 points.

To quote (Lt. Gen.) Harry Kinnard: "The price of admission to the tank battle will be killing the enemy's attack helicopters." How will we kill the Hind? Fixed-wing fighters certainly aren't the answer. Our fighters are going to be engaged in their own air-to-air war, or hitting targets that the Air Force considers a higher priority.

A jet fighter isn't much good against a helicopter, anyway. You know the old WW II fighters could not shoot down a low, slow flying Cub during WWII. Jets are going to be even less effective against a helicopter. Well, both the Soviets and we have concluded that our helicopter are capable of hitting their armored targets and still remaining out of reach of anti-aircraft weapons so we're not going to kill the Hind with our anti-aircraft weapons.

The question is, "How do we kill the **Hind** before he kills 15 tanks? The Soviet solution seems to be the **Hind** with its speed, and I suspect, air-to-air weapons. We, on the other hand, appear to have completely ignored the problem of killing the **Hind** to save our tanks. With great timidity we seem to be at last looking at the problem of protecting our helicopters from the **Hind**.

The most aggressive action I have seen is the provision for air-to-air missiles on the AHIP. Of course, "provision for" will no more kill an enemy tank than unfunded parts will help our present flying hour program.

Putting air-to-air missiles on the AHIP bothers me. It gives me a mental picture of a few 4,000 lb., 100 knot AHIPs guarding our attack helicopters as a heavily armed, 22,000 lb., 180 knot Hind roars in. This is like asking a small sheep dog to protect the flock against a mountain lion. It's just not a fair fight.

The AHIP may get off a shot against the **Hind** in defense, but it is not going to pursue, and it certainly isn't going to go over and try to prevent the **Hinds** from attacking our tanks.

The anti-helicopter role deserves a lot more attention, study, funding, development, and testing than it is now receiving. Adopting old, or even developing new weapons systems to be carried on present aircraft, is not the answer. However, I would certainly go along with putting some good air-to-air weapons on the AH-64 as at least an interim solution to the problem. The weapons are not the total solution.

Speed and maneuverability for the carrier vehicle are essential. If that statement is not true, I would like to point out that the Air Forces of the world have certainly wasted billions of dollars developing new fighter aircraft.

#### The question of cost

I have identified three areas as potential for Army effort. New efforts usually cost money. Money is always tight. To be realistic in my comments, I should say something about cost,

First area: Be responsive to the ground commander and improve Army Aviation's image. This doesn't cost money but it does require a lot of work, dedication, and smarts.

The second area: Intra-theater airlift. No cost at this time if you support the Marines and they continue to develop the JVX.

The third area: Air-to-air. Very expensive but so important that I think it should get the highest in priority. Thank you very much.



## AVIATION UNIT OF THE YEAR AWARD

Remarks of General Donald R. Keith, CG, U.S. Army Materiel Development and Readiness Command:

General Smith, award winners, fellow soldiers, friends of Army Aviation, ladies and gentlemen. It is a great pleasure and a personal honor to be a part of this very special celebration

tonight.

If you looked at your program you know that there have been some changes — another distinguished soldier was supposed to be doing what I was supposed to do, and I was to present the award that that rat who is stealing my command just did. He not only gets to make the only award where a kiss is given rather than a hand-shake but he gets the greatest command in the Army as far as I'm concerned.

#### Something superb

On the other side of the coin I just think it's neat and right that I get a chance to be present here instead of General Thurman because, as (President) Jim Smith said, I've been laboring in the pits since the source selection and evaluation process for all of the new birds that you guys are now beginning to enjoy.

I can't think of a finer, warmer feeling than to have the opportunity on my last year of active duty to be able to present an award to an outfit that did something absolutely superb because they were equipped with some of the things over

which we've been laboring in the pits.

It's always a great pleasure when you you're able to recognize people because, as you've heard tonight, people are what make us tick. With aviators (I always like to be able to josh 'em a little bit about the (aviation) Mafia with whom I have grown up over the years) we have a very tight knit group and it's a group — if you happen to be accepted by them — where there's a very special warm feeling. I have felt very much a part of the aviation community even though I never learned how to fly one of your aircraft.

I've watched the professionalism, tremendous spirit, and motivation that is the embodiment of an Army Aviator and all of those who support Army Aviation in the process. I can personally attest to the professionalism of two Army pilots with whom I flew some three weeks ago in a U-21F. We were returning to Washington from Atlanta and came in on that day on which those of you who live here will recall that a really rare storm took place — a thunderstorm, snow, high winds, and lightning.

We were about a half an hour out from Belvoir and lightning hit our U-21F. The first thing that I could think of was that someone got an SA-7 for I've been very sensitized to terrorism these days. There was one heck of a ball of fire out where the engine cowling joins the wing, but despite these handicaps our two captains, Collins and Lang, from Belvoir's Davison Aviation Command, got that aircraft on the ground safely at Andrews without incident . and I just owe them a lot. There were a few frayed nerves — mine included — and I must say after I got down and we all kind of got over this we all looked at each other and said, "Thank God there's something left for us to do on this earth!"

#### A proud history

As you all know, Army Aviation has a long and illustrious history dating back to June, 1942 when the War Department approved the integral aviation element in the field artillery. Forty-one years later, Army Aviation really came into its own when on April 13 this past year the Secretary of the Army approved Aviation as a separate Army branch.

On June 6, 1983 the Chief of Staff signed the letter which directed that responsibility for the Aviation branch go to Fort Rucker where it belongs and issued the Aviation Branch Implementation Plan. I'm sure that all of you here tonight will agree that that was a bold and giant step that recognizes the increasing importance of Army Aviation's role as a member of the combined arms team.

Since my command is responsible for the R&D, and the procurement, fielding, and support of the Army's equipment, it seems appropriate for me to say just a few words about our present aircraft and some of those that are planned for your future.

During the past 20 years we've made great strides in developing and fielding the most useful and effective fleet of aircraft the Army and, in fact, the world has ever known. Those rotary and fixed wing aircraft have served us very well in Vietnam and more recently in Central America, the Middle East, and elsewhere. Our product-improved workhorses continue to perform well but the new generation coming into the force are simply incredible.

#### Magnificent machines

The Boeing Vertol CH-47D is getting rave notices from those who have been exposed to its performance and added reliability. Likewise, Sikorsky's BLACK HAWK has proven its worth in combat. I'll say a little bit more about that later. And as you know, just this month the National Aeronautic Association announced that the annual Collier Trophy will be awarded to the Army and the Hughes Helicopters industry team for their fine work on the APACHE Attack Helicopter. I don't need to tell all of you here that this trophy represents the greatest honor that can be given — it is considered the "Oscar" of the aerospace industry.

The Association labelled the APACHE as the "Free World's most capable anti-tank helicopter establishing a new standard of excellence for

ground combat weapons."

Both Hughes, their team, and the Army can be very proud of adding this magnificent fighting machine to the Army's arsenal of weapons. That fine aircraft will serve us for the remainder of the '80's and well into the '90's, but we can't afford to stop there. We're currently examining the Army's needs for the mid-90's and the 21st century. Our planners have concluded, among other things, that we need an aircraft that will be lightweight, fast, maneuverable, and easily deployable. Also, it has to perform effectively in a very wide variety of threats that are even more severe than today's.

You all have heard a lot at this convention about that next generation aircraft that we now have on the drawing boards and hope to get launched this year. It will harness a careful blend of state-of-the-art technologies that are now available because we, and our industrial partners, have done the necessary R&D and other homework in prior years — and we must continue to do that if we're to keep pace.

We plan, as you have heard, to acquire at least two versions of this aircraft: scout/attack and utility. A logical question might be: Why does the Army need such an advanced flying machine?

It's because we expect that the forces that we might have to face in the next century will continue to be numerically superior and that we must be capable of protecting our national interests in all types of weather, in the sand and dust of the deserts and at the high altitudes on hot days. We also must be able to operate over protracted periods with limited opportunity for resupply and we must think more and more about that as we enter the 21st century with a widely dispersed and highly lethal battlefield.

All of that is the big order that we must attempt to fill but I'm confident that our aerospace industry can and will meet the challenge with us. We'll be through a number of iterations before we get there but I think we'll get there.


#### The unit of the year

So much for our aviation equipment . . Now it's time to recognize the unit that has been voted the "Most Outstanding Aviation Unit of the Year" — a unit that has employed some of those fine aircraft that I mentioned earlier. I'm referring, of course, to the 160th Aviation Battalion (Assault Helicopter) (Reinforced) — Task Force 160.

They are a part of the 101st Airborne Division located at Fort Campbell, but they've done an awful lot of other things that we can't talk about here tonight.

In addition to playing a vital role in combat, the 160th Battalion has done a lot in the world with which I'm more familiar. They served as an important test bed for new aviation equipment and tactics.

Among many other achievements they developed long range helicopter navigation techniques which can be adapted by rotary and fixed wing aviation units anywhere in the world. It also developed and tested techniques for employing night vision goggles in the cockpits of the BLACK HAWK and the CH-47D. And, finally, Task Force 160 tested improvements in cockpit equipment and techniques for what we call the "cockpit enhancement program." This resulted in reduced space, weight, power, and pilot workload requirements which, in turn,

## ROBERT M. LEIGH SPECIAL AWARD

Remarks of Lt. Gen. Charles W. Bagnal, Deputy Commanding General, U.S. Army Training & Doctrine Command:

It is my great pleasure to be with you here this evening and to present the "Robert M. Leich Special Award" to the Mississippi Army Aviation Classification Activity Depot command-

ed by Colonel James H. Burns.

Briefly, the Mississippi Army Aviation Classification Repair Activity Depot has been an integral part of the Army National Guard's Aviation Logistics Support Program since its inception in 1971. It was originally organized to provide general support aircraft maintenance to the Army Aviation units of the southeastern U.S., Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands, and since its inception it has steadily increased its level of expertise and its capabilities.

#### A dual mission

Its mission today, like most Army Guard units, is a dual one. During pre-mobilization it performs aviation intermediate maintenance, support, and designated depot maintenance for Army aircraft; aircraft armament; aviation ground support equipment; and associated components for both the Army National Guard and some Active Army aviation programs.

During post-mobilization it acts as a Aviation Depot Maintenance round-out unit; provides back-up support and depot-level maintenance to deploying and deployed forces; and is ready to provide tailored maintenance and repair teams as required.

The accomplishments of this Activity during the past year or so are long and varied. They have returned 49 aircraft to service under the OH-6 Crash Damage Repair Program that would otherwise have been lost to the Army. They're in the midst of an ongoing program to refurbish and transfer AH-1 COBRA aircraft from the Active Army to the Army National Guard — with seven completed and nine being worked, and 12 programmed for this next FY. Their retention and recruiting record is outstanding as evidenced by their receiving the prestigious 100% strength award, and their own in-house maintenance and safety records are superb.

For example, their vehicles have travelled over 600,000 accident-free miles and they have flown, in the last three years, 1,700 accident-free

hours.

Finally, they've been valued members of the local community by providing their special expertise during disasters and local aircraft emergencies.

#### **Outstanding professionalism**

This list of accomplishments is illustrative of the professionalism of this outstanding unit and its members. They have established a standard of performance and level of excellence that deserves to be emulated by every Active and Reserve Component aviation unit. They are clearly the best there is in their business, having distinguished themselves through the professionalism of the the individuals, outstanding leadership at all levels, and constant pursuit of excellence.

They have certainly earned our respect and appreciation and it is my honor, this evening, to present this year's "Robert M. Leich Special Award" to the Mississippi Army Aviation Classification Activity Depot and its Commander, Colonel James H. Burns.

## OUTSTANDING RESERVE COMPONENT AVIATION UNIT OF THE YEAR AWARD

Remarks of Lt. Gen. Lavern E. Weber, Military Executive to the Reserve Forces Policy Board:

President Jim, members of Quad-A, distinguished guests, ladies and gentlemen: it's a great personal privelege for me to be here tonight and to join with Major General Herbert Temple, Director of the Army National Guard, as Quad-A recognizes Company D, 28th Combat Aviation Battalion as the Outstanding Reserve Component Unit for the year of 1983. Jim, to you and Quad-A, my congratulations on your continuing support for Army Aviation, particularly over this past year as Aviation became another Branch in our Army. Your support was deeply needed and we appreciate it very much.

#### Trust and confidence

The trust and confidence that the Army has placed in its Reserve Components is indeed warranted. In 1983 the Reserve Component — with its 7,000 aviators and 3,100 plus aircraft — flew 400,000 flying hours. They flew those with a very creditable safety record. In fact, in the United States Army Reserve it could not have been better, for they flew at a zero accident rate. In the case of the Army National Guard they flew two point zero. These are creditable showings. We're proud of them, and we're proud of the support that we continue to get from Quad-A.

Now, joining me to help cite Company D is Major General Herb Temple, the Director of the Army National Guard, National Guard Bureau.

Remarks of Maj. Gen. Herbert R. Temple, Director of the National Guard Bureau:

May I ask Major Julius Avant, the Commander of Company D of the 28th Combat Aviation Battalion to join me at the rostrum, please.

Ladies and Gentlemen, I'm going to take a few moments to relate to you the accomplishments of this unusual organization and a highly talented Commander who stands at my side this evening.

Company D of the 28th Combat Aviation Battalion of the North Carolina Army National Guard so distinguished itself in all phases of its activities during fiscal year 1983, it is named the Outstanding Reserve Component Aviation Unit of the Year for 1983. The accomplishments of the unit and the individual qualifications of unit members are very impressive.

Company D is a roundout unit for the 28th Infantry Division of the Pennsylvannia Army National Guard — and the Commander of the 28th Division is here with us this evening — and joins with the parent unit once each year at annual training. During the remainder of the year, it trains under the direction of the Adjutant General of North Carolina, and the distinguished Adjutant General of North Carolina is also with us here this evening.

This arrangement necessitates frequent communication and coordination. The results are evidenced by this units' performance. During annual training in 1983, the unit was administered a three-day Army Training and Evaluation Program, and was rated outstanding in night training operations, scenario-oriented training, development and utilization of junior officers, operators, maintenance and food-service operations. Annual training 1983 concluded with live-fire platoon night attacks utilizing night vision goggles.

#### **Extensive training**

Training included terrain flight, nap-of-theearth, extensive unaided night and night vision goggle programs, unit night movements, aeroweapons qualification and flight involving mission-oriented protective posture gear. Throughout this challenging training supervision, saftey awareness and professional execution were such that the unit did not experience a Class A or B or C accident.

Although the unit is not scheduled to get AH-1S aircraft until 1984, by the end of 1983 the

unit had five unit instructor pilots qualified in AH-1S and 60 members of the unit had received AH-1S maintenance training. Company D is approximately one year ahead of the training plan prescribed for the Army National Guard's Attack Helicopter Companies.

Like most National Guard units, Company D was called on throughout the year to provide assistance beyond its training parameters. This included limited support to the Reserve Officers Training Corps, support to an ongoing Department of Energy/Department of Defense combined test, and serving as a jump platform for jump teams at various functions. It also included participation in several mercy and humanitarian missions. For heroic efforts during rescue missions, unit members have received two North Carolina Meritorious Service Medals with the "V" device. One Army Soldiers Medal and three awards are pending approval.

This unit embodies all the characteristics that we expect in an outstanding military unit, and demonstrates what a Reserve Component Unit when propoerly led, properly motivated and properly resourced can accomplish in surpassing its training goals. Company D merits its recognition as the Reserve Component Aviation Unit of the Year.



## AVIATION SOLDIER OF THE YEAR

Remarks of Lt. Gen. James H. Merryman, Deputy Chief of Staff for Research, Development and Acquisition, U.S. Army:

Far too often, when we talk about where the credit is due, the credit is given to General What's His Name, or some Colonel What's His Name, or Captain so and so, but there's one thing we soldiers know, as I look out on this audience tonight, and that's where, in fact, the credit is due. And it's not due the General; not due the Colonel; or the Captain — it's the soldier.

#### The Army is people

It's like Creighton Abrams said when he was alive: "The Army is people and the people is the soldier."

The highest honor that I could be given all year, in all honesty, is to be able to take a few minutes of your time and talk about this year's "Aviation Soldier of the Year." I'm especially pleased because this young man is a member of a battalion that I had a certain amount to do with 17 year ago. Lord, the time flies! The Black Barons — the 269th in Vietnam.

I'm especially pleased because I see that he's continuing in the tradition that many people in this audience started: **Terry Henry**, whom you'll see here shortly and some others. What I'm talking about is the excellence that Army Avia-

tion has always exhibited to the Army. I'll put it another way — we've shown them the way to go; we've shown the rest of the Army which way and how to go.

#### A man to watch

This young man came in the Army just a few years ago; he came in as a Spec Four down in the 196th Aviation Company at Ft. Bragg. He immediately impressed all of his seniors to the extent that they put him on a promotion list and they also made him a crew chief of a CH-47. I don't know if some of you young ladies know what that is, but a CH-47 is the biggest thing we've got; it's the most complex aircraft we've got; carries more, big, all kinds of things.

Now if you can imagine one young soldier being in charge of making sure that big thing that will carry all these tons of equipment works right anytime you want to fly it, and this young man did just that. He did it to the extent that all of the other soldiers at Ft. Bragg — and that's a big post and there are a lot of helicopters down there — all of the other guys started to watch him. As a result, they started ending up with readiness rates like they've never had before. Now understand this — readiness rates because they wanted to emulate what this young man had done.

His efforts were not limited to what he did in aviation. He excelled throughout. He was a

It is with great honor and with great humility on my part that I introduce **David Amos** as the "Aviation Soldier of the Year."





communications or a jammer of enemy
signals. With FLIR, its mission capabilities
will extend into the night. And after each
flight it returns to its retrieval net to be
readied for another sortie.

There's an alternative to exposing a multimillion dollar aircraft and its crew to the risks of many tactical missions: Aquila—the tough bird that gives flexibility to commanders and nothing but trouble to the enemy.



## ARMY AVIATOR OF THE YEAR AWARD

Remarks of Lt. Gen. Jack V. Mackmull, Commanding General, XVIII Airborne Corps and Fort Bragg, North Carolina:

General Smith, ladies and gentlemen: it is indeed my pleasure to present the "Army Aviator of the Year Award" which is the most prestigious award that one can receive from his peers.

#### A distinguished record

CW3 "Tony" Kraay was born in Spokane, Washington, in 1951, entered the service in 1969, served as a crewchief in Vietnam. Following this tour, he attended the Warrant Officer Rotary Wing Aviator Course at Ft. Rucker where he was the Distinguished Graduate of his class. After flight school he attended the COBRA Course at Ft. Rucker and upon its completion was assigned to Troop C, 7/17 Cav in Vietnam.

Other assignments included 3/5th Cav at Ft. Lewis, 128th Aviation Company in Korea, the Standardization Department at Ft. Rucker, and, finally, where he is now: Company C, 3rd Aviation Battalion (Combat), Schweinfurt, Germany, where he and Carole live.

He's a graduate of the COBRA Qualification Course, the UH-1 Instructor Pilot Course, Rotary Wing Examiner Course, and, finally, the Warrant Officer Advanced Course where he again was the Distinguished Graduate of his class.

He is a senior Army Aviator and has also been awarded the Bronze Star. CW3 Kraay has served in such a wide variety of positions within Army Aviation that he is now among the elite few. As a UH-1 crew chief in Vietnam, later as a COBRA pilot there, CW3 Kraay not only contributed to the war effort but to the development of the most mobile concept in land warfare, Army Aviation.

His distinguished record as an instructor of all kinds of flying and aerial gunnery enabled him to immediately set an example for all aviators to emulate upon his arrival in Germany on assignment to Company C, 3rd Combat Aviation Battalion.

#### An example to follow

His example as a platoon leader and instructor pilot has served as the focal point for an attack helicopter unit which is now made up almost entirely of first tour aviators. The real success of CW3 Kraay can be observed in the confident manner in which these officers have performed on the flight line, in the classroom, and on maneuvers. In addition to this, CW3 Kraav was the company's Night Vision Goggle I.P., won the USAREUR Helicup Competition, was Airfield Officer at Schweinfurt where he rewrote all of the local flying regulations, had an accident-free year in his platoon, scored the highest score in USAREUR on the annual writ, and, finally, wrote a song called, "Snake Drivers in the Sky" to the tune of the old Frankie Lane "Ghost Riders in the Sky".

Carole, would you please stand? Behind every good man, there's a Carole. Please join me in recognizing CW3 "Tony" Kraay as Quad-A's "Army Aviator of the Year".

## SCIENCE/SCOPE

A new battlefield position information system is being produced for the U.S. Army and Marine Corps by Hughes Aircraft Company. The Position Location Reporting System (PLRS) automatically supplies position and navigation data through a computerized communications network.

Troops learn their position by reading a display on a hand-held unit. PLRS uses spread spectrum, frequency hopping, and cryptographic techniques to protect data from being intercepted or jammed by the enemy. Should a unit fall into enemy hands, it can be eliminated from the system.

The TOW antitank missile will have greater armorpiercing capacity as a result of modifications being made during the second phase of an improvement program. The new TOW 2, now in production, carries a heavier warhead occupying the entire sixinch diameter of the missile body. An extensible probe on the nose of the missile allows the warhead to detonate at a more effective moment just prior to full impact.

To compensate for the added weight of the heavier warhead and other modifications, the flight motor has been reloaded with an improved propellant to provide a higher impulse. The guidance system has also been improved so the missile can be guided through smoke and other battlefield obscurants. The TOW 2 project is focusing initially on infantry ground and vehicle applications. Hughes produces TOW for the U.S. Army.







The management success of this program, plus the fact that the aircraft has exceeded both performance and operational readiness goals after one year and more than 3,000 flight hours in the hands of the user, bears out my belief that a dedicated Government/Contractor team, working within the Army's well structured acquisition process, can produce an effective weapon system within cost and on schedule.

A key ingredient in developing, fielding, and sustaining a sophisticated new system is team work. As with past successes, future successes

To this end, considerable effort is being expended to accelerate as much as possible the conversion of T55-L-11D engines to the L-712 configuration.





# CH-47D: SUCCESS IN THE HANDS OF THE USER

T has been nearly a year since the CH-47 DELTA was last discussed in this medium and since that time, numerous events have transpired which have, and will continue to significantly affect the CH-47D, the US Army, and the Project Manager's Office.

This article presents an excellent opportunity for me to discuss highlights of the present program with particular emphasis on where we've been and where we are today as it relates to fielding of the CH-47D system and finally, to take a look at what the future holds in store.

#### Program update

With the recent signing of our FY 84 contract for the modernization of 36 aircraft, we are now dedicated to pursuing a multiyear contract for FY 85 thru FY 89. A CH-47 modernization multiyear procurement offers several significant advantages. It will permit existing medium lift fleet as well as industrial base and CH-47D modernization program stability while providing increased cost savings.

The proposed 5-year multiyear contract beginning in FY 85 at a production rate of 48 aircraft per year would save an estimated \$153 million over single year contracts besides offering some much needed stability to our modernization program while significantly enhancing our long range force structure and fielding planning. Based upon the potential savings and program stability discussed above, the CH-47 PM is energetically pursuing this FY 85-89 multiyear procurement.

Additionally, the prime contractor, Boeing Vertol, and all its vendors, are dedicated to a "will do" attitude in achieving this unprecedented initiative.

#### IOC achieved

As many of you are already aware, initial fielding to the 101st Air Assault Division at Ft. Campbell, KY, began in February 1983 and fielding continues today. It is significant to note that 100% of all required support was available prior to initial fielding and we are totally dedicated to achieving that goal, a system "first", for all subsequent units.

In addition, Initial operational capability (IOC) was achieved at Ft. Campbell on 28 February 1984, on schedule and one year to the day after we delivered the first aircraft. IOC marks the fielding of the first 24-ship company within the 159th Aviation Battalion with continued effort toward fielding a 16-ship company in April 1984 and a third 24-ship company in November 1984.

The CH-47D IOC is also significant in that it demonstrates that a system can be fielded on schedule with 100% of the support package available to include all provisioning, publications, and crew training. The on schedule IOC at Ft. Campbell is testimony to the hard work and dedication put forth by all elements of the U.S. Army in assuring a successful fielding of this aircraft and its continued support well into the future.

It is also significant to note that the reliability, availability, and maintainability (RAM) improvements provided by the CH-47D has enabled the IOC unit to exceed the DA mission capable rate by 9%, cutting the not mission



capable supply (NMCS) rate by one haif and meeting the not mission capable maintenance (NMCM) rate (based on 22 aircraft with 2214 flying hours through 15 February 1984).

#### Equipment Improvements (PIP)

There are other product Improvement proposals (PIPs) that, in addition to modernization, are managed by the CH-47 Project Manager's Office. While each PIP in itself is important to the fielded fleet in terms of maintaining mission capable rates and improving the CH-47s RAM features, a few should be singled out as significant.

• Night Vision Goggle (NVG) compatibility is a superior night fix cockpit being installed by kit on the CH-47D and is compatible with both the PVS-5 and AVS-6 goggles. Our plan calls for productionizing and expanding the NVG compatibility to the total aircraft. These changes will be incorporated on the aircraft by engineering change proposal beginning with the FY 85 buy.

Two additional TRADOC priority one PIPs for the CH-47D are the Improved Deployment Capability and the Helicopter Internal Cargo Handling System (HICHS). These two work together as the HICHS accommodates the new and improved deployment fuel tanks. These two PIPs are jointly funded beginning in FY 85, to gain the optimal benefits of both improvements.

● The Fiberglass Rotor Blade (FRB) retrofit program continues on schedule. Fleet retrofit started in November 1981 and continues in both CONUS and USAREUR. The total FRB program is planned for 174 CH-47C aircraft worldwide with scheduled completion in 2nd Qtr FY 86. All PIPs are designed to either improve

the CH-47D or enable the CH-47C to maintain the highest mission capable rate possible unt the medium helicopter fleet is completel modernized.

#### Total fleet manager

As a result of the recent organization of AVSCOM, the CH-47 Modernization PMC charter has been increased to include flee management of all cargo helicopters. This means that the PMO will manage all models of the CH-47 as well as the CH-54 currently operated by the National Guard. By absorbing the personnel and the mission and functions of the Readiness Project Office (RPO), the CH-47 Modernization PMO is truly the total flee manager. Now all facets of support and eng neering will be handled by a single office within a single command. The merging of the two of fices should lend itself to better support of the fleet by decreasing duplication of effort, may imizing existing resources, effectively utilizing personnel, and most of all, having on "voice" speak for the cargo helicopter fleet.

#### Summary

At this time I would like to summarize som key points. We in the CH-47 Modernizatio PMO are very proud of our efforts in the in tegrated logistics areas. Logistics have bee and will continue to be intensively managed Our policy of fielding helicopters only if they ca be totally supported will continue in the future

As stated previously, with the recent signin of our FY 84 contract, we're now energeticall dedicated to pursuing a multiyear contract for FY 85 to FY 89. The stable cost estimates stable aircraft configuration, and prove technology still make the CH-47D an idea multiyear procurement candidate.

We're very proud that the CH-47D has give the user in the field what he needs when h needs it. Based on initial fielding experience, a program objectives for operational capability reliability and maintainability, and operational readiness have been exceeded.

This next year offers many challenges. We're confident we can meet these challenges and with the continued support of our total Army/ir dustry team, know we can continue providing the U.S. soldier with the finest medium lift helicopter in the world.



## CH-47D: THE 101ST IS PROUD TO HAVE YOU!

s you know, the Ch-47 has been in the Army's aircraft inventory for over 20 years. During these years, it has served the needs of the Army well in both peace and combat; and, as technology progressed, the CH-47 models progressed from A to B to C, with each providing increased capabilities.

#### An Important milestone

Now we in the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) have completed the Initial operational capability (IOC) of the CH-47 D-Model. This delivery of the first 24 D-Models to the 159th Aviation Battalion has set the example for taking an airframe that is limited only by its systems (which through the years and the advance of technology have become outdated) and making it more reliable and capable with state-of-the-art technology.

In this case, using payload alone as an example, our capability has risen from the 11,000 pound payload limit of the A-Model to that of 22,000 pounds for the D-Model. The result is that Army Aviation gets a modernized aircraft, as the A's, B's and C's are rebuilt, for a fraction of the cost of purchasing new aircraft.

#### **Huge savings**

The full cost impact of such a rebuild program is realized when you consider that the Army's CH-47 Modernization Program plans for Boeing Vertol to modernize 436 CHINOOKs, and that modernization, instead of new CH-47D production, saves more than \$3 million per aircraft in investment costs alone.

# CH-47D: MOVING INTO THE FIELD

he press release states, "February 28, 1984 . . U.S. Army's CH-47 modernization program successfully recorded another major milestone today when the first CH-47D unit — comprised of 24 modernized "D-Model" Chinook helicopters — reached its initial operational capability (IOC)."

That sounds simple enough — straight forward and to the point. However, should you visit the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) and request to see the CHINOOK company with 24 CH-47D's, you will find it does not exist.

#### Adjustments were needed

To understand what happened, it is necessary to know the organization of the Army's only TO&E CHINOOK battalion and its current configuration. Under the "J"-series TO&E, the 159th Aviation Battalion (Medium Helicopter) includes a Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment and two companies, A and B, each containing 24 helicopters.

However, due to the need for CH-47 support in other areas, A Company, with 16 of its aircraft, was detached from the battalion. Therefore, the battalion's organization was an HHD and one line company of 32 aircraft. As we looked at the contingency missions, in addition to the normal support required by the division, and looked to the upcoming fielding of the CH-47D, it was obvious some adjustments needed to be made.

So, in June 1982, in order to support the division's training cycle, meet contingency re-

quirements, and prepare to accept the "D-Model", we elected to activate C Company under a local use MTO&E. The immediate benefits of the C Company activation were the increase in the "leader to led" ratio it provided and, with B and C Company as a base (each containing 16 aircraft), the flexibility to continue to support the division and prepare for the "D-Model". Let me explain.


Our slice of an Aviation Battalion Task Force that is formed to support an Air Assault Brigade Task Force is one platoon (8 aircraft). We rotate our platoons through the division's Gold, Black, and White training cycle on a quarterly basis.

However, this is not a "stand alone" system for our platoons due to the fact that our aircraft maintenance flow is managed at company level and, coupled with a shortage of pilots-in-command, it is common to cross platoon lines for both aircraft and crews in order to support mission taskings.

#### The D-Model arrives

From the standpoint of preparing for the D-model, the delivery was scheduled to begin with one aircraft per month for the first six months and then increase to two per month. Training for the enlisted flight crewmembers and shops personnel was scheduled to be accomplished by sending an average of ten a month to Ft. Eustis for their D-model training.

Thus, throughout the IOC we were continually short enlisted crews for the "32" aircraft we were to maintain. Therefore, to support the division's training program and keep the disruption to our internal training at a minimum, we decided the distribution of D-models would alternate between B and C companies with the com-

panies alternating platoons. This "even buildup" of D-models throughout the battalion provided the needed flexibility and allowed for a smooth transition of the CH-47D into the division.

On 28 February 1983, we received the first CH-47D. In fact, two were delivered. At that time, the battalion's fleet of aircraft consisted of 19 B models and 10 C models. Three aircraft had already been transferred for induction into the rebuild program, thus the two D's brought us to 31 aircraft and added another letter to the "alphabet soup" of our aviation maintenance and operations. By that I mean that we were maintaining and operating B's, C's, "Super" C's, "Super" C's with 712 engines and fiberglass rotorblades, and now D's. Also, just like all other Chinook units at that time, we were continuing to work our way out of the world-wide grounding with B model "C-boxes" being the final hurdle to clear.

#### Our weak point

Our weak point was our own AVUM support. Recall that A Company, with 16 aircraft, was detached. This meant we were now supporting 32 aircraft with an AVUM package of tools and equipment "designed" to support 24 aircraft. To compound the problem, this was being accomplished out of one hangar which had been constructed to meet the needs of one 16-aircraft company.

True to our motto "Press On!", the soldiers of the battalion demonstrated a "can do" attitude and a spirit of teamwork and cooperation that overcame the obstacles of limited facilities, oneof-a-kind tools and equipment, and, clearly, the limitations dictated by an MTO&E that was designed to support at levels above division. This was done at a cost of many long hours in excess of what soldiers in a peacetime environment should have to devote toward the accomplishment of their work, and I am proud of them for all they have done.

The D-model has flown over 2400 hours and maintained a 79 % fully mission capable (FMC) rate. It has proven to be not only a better performing CHINOOK, but its maintenance hours per flight hour are almost half of that required for other CH-47 models. Unfortunately, our not mission capable maintenance (NMCM) rate exceeded the standard (15 %) throughout the IOC; I attribute this in large part to the limited maintenance facilities and equipment available to the battalion and the number of aircraft to be maintained. Therefore, because of the mixture of the fleet, we are not yet seeing a true picture of the D-model's maintainability.

#### Increased capabilities

A review of the D-model flight hours reveals that two-thirds were charged to training (e.g., D-model transitions, NVG training, etc.). However, support is the name of the game and with each support mission flown, we are working to improve the methods and procedures used in order to take full advantage of the increased capabilities of the D-model. An excellent example is the Air Assault Artillery Raid. To move an M102 battery with the B or C model required six aircraft and the single cargo hook limited flight speeds to 60-70 knots. With the D-model, we have developed procedures to carry two M102's in a tandem rig configuration using the D's fore and aft cargo hooks which not only reduces the number of aircraft

required from six to three but increases allowable flight speeds to 120-140 knots.

Again, support is the key, and the necessity of the CH-47 being an integral part of the Air Assault Division is even more clear after reviewing the results of a recent division CPX in which the CH-47's were played as a full battalion (48 CH-47D's) and moved one-fifth of the Class I, III, and V tonnage. The rapidity with which the Air Assault Division can move on the battlefield dictates that its support have that same capability. The CH-47D is the keystone of that capability in the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault).

#### A bit of advice

In closing, there is one bit of advice I would offer to any unit fielding a new weapons system as part of the Force Modernization Program — stay on top of internal programs. The unit must continue to function as such; individual and collective training must remain at the top of your list of priorities. In fact, in our case, fielding the D-model became an additional requirement because during the IOC the battalion received an EXEVAL, AGI, FORSCOM ARMS, and

both B and C Companies received EDRE's. Also, during the IOC, field training exercises included, in addition to those here at Ft. Campbell, self-deployment of 4 D's to Ft. Stewart, 4 D's to Eglin AFB, 4 D's to Ft. Drum, 2 D's to Ottawa (as part of the small unit exchange program), and most recently, 3 D's to Ft. Bliss with internal fuel tanks providing extended range capability.

#### Looking ahead

We are looking forward to the completion of the IOC for our next 24 CH-47D's. The success of this IOC is the result of outstanding teamwork between Boeing Vertol and the CH-47 Program Manager to insure our needs were met and that problems were resolved quickly and efficiently. A special word of thanks to MAJ(P) Bob Markham, chief of the materiel fielding team. Also, due to our limited AVUM capability, we have depended on the AVIM units of the 5th Transportation Battalion for much more than just the normal intermediate-level maintenance. Their support, both before and since receipt of the D-models, has been outstanding. We could not have made it without them.



### CH-47D: DARCOM REVISITS THE DELTA

t has been one year since we presented our observations on the progress of the CH-47 Modernization Program. The conclusion was that effective program management and a concerted team effort on the part of many agencies had culminated in the initial delivery of a modernized weapon system on time, within budget, and with no compromises in performance, effectiveness, or supportability.

One year later, on the acheivement of the Initial Operatiing Capability (IOC) by the first gaining unit, was a propitious time to observe the correlation between the development effort and field experience. The final test of any system is employment by the user under actual field conditions. How is developmental management reflected in the field environment? Have we learned from previous fielding shortcomings? What lessons have we learned from this particular exercise?

#### Where it counts the most

The CH-47D is probably the first aircraft that was not delivered to the user before a total support package was in place. Spare parts (100% quantity and range of PLL/ASL) were also on hand. A complete complement of special tools and test equipment was in place. Trained personnel were available and stabilized. Validated and verified technical manuals were provided. When the first CH-47D touched down at Fort Campbell, an operational capability existed. The value of total pre-deployment planning was demonstrated where it counts the most.

The materiel fielding team (MFT) is a key link between the developer and the using organization. This team paves the road between the development community and the real world where survival itself can depend upon the effectiveness of the equipment provided to the Army in the field.

The CH-47D MFT, headed by MAJ Bob Markham, has set an example that should serve as a model in future weapon system introduction. The team, including instructors, logisticians, and technical personnel, has been instrumental in the development of a superior combat capability by the gaining command. Innovative management and strong leadership are vital for an effective MFT.

During the initial introduction and familiarization with the new equipment, the MFT and the Program Manager provided detailed management attention to those problems which could delay or degrade the transition process. As the user gained experience and confidence, the management responsibility was also transitioned to the gaining command. The 159th Aviation Battalion has developed pride in their capability and acceptance of their responsibility to provide enhanced combat support to the parent division.

#### Even better next time

Although fielding of the Delta is considered a success story, an ongoing Post-Fielding Review indicates that even our best laid plans can be impacted by some unforseen events.

 There is still no single unit fully equipped with this aircraft. The gradual phasing out of earlier models witht the concurrent replacement by the Delta provided a good comparison of the capabilities and maintainability



of the new aircraft as compared to the old. At the same time, problems were noted in maintenance due to equipment dissimiliarity and the need to maintain support equipment and parts stockage for two systems.

 A higher supply priority was granted to the 159th. This benefits the 159th during the transition period, but adversely affects other units.

 The delayed redistribution of displaced assets has created a problem for the 159th.
 Redistribution scheduling and implementation must be maintained to avoid a maintenance burden on the owning unit.

 Unforseen requirements for some peculiar spare parts and components necessitated reliance on contractor support.

• An effective loan/payback system was instituted that exercised the normal supply system and retained essential usage data. It maintains unit readiness, but demonstrated deficiencies in support analysis and provisioning forecasting. The flight simulator installed at Fort Campbell is limited in its benefit to CH-47D pilots. The need for concurrent fielding of all training devices is emphasized by this problem.

These details show that there are questions to be answered and lessons to be learned from even the best examples of equipment development and introduction. The enthusiastic response to the CH-47D fielding indicates that exceptional management during system development has been continued through the materiel fielding. The transition to full operational capability leaves no doubt that past mistakes have been recognized and avoided. We still have lessons to be learned from this example. A developmental management responsibility continues long after the operational capability is established.

#### An ongoing job

The ability to accurately forecast equipment/component reliability and durability still eludes us and generates budgeting and supply problems. The training and retention of skilled technicians remains as a limitation on ful system capability. The availability of full system support at initial deployment is a major factor in user acceptance and effectiveness. Recognition and resolution of problems prior to a crisis is a responsibility shared by the developer, the user and the logistics community. The teamwork tha delivered the CH-47D on time, within budget without compromise on essential requirements has continued to acheive the initial operating capability.

The Delta was delivered and the Delta now delivers in its intended role.
